**MEMORANDUM FOR STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM BETWEEN
INDIAN INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SENAPATI
AND
NATIONAL FORENSIC SCIENCES UNIVERSITY (NFSU)**

Whereas the Indian Institute of Information Technology Senapati, Manipur is an institution under Ministry of Higher Education, Govt. of India. IIIT Senapati, Manipur was established in 2015 in order to develop Manipur as preferred destination for Information Technology (IT) related manpower and industry.

Whereas the National Forensic Sciences University, an Institution of National Importance, having its headquarter at Sector — 9, Gandhinagar - 382007, Gujarat is established by an Act passed in the year 2020 by the Parliament of India, to facilitate and promote studies and research and to achieve excellence in the field of forensic science in conjunction with applied behavioural science studies, law, criminology and other allied areas and technology and other related fields, and to provide for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. The status of "Centre of Excellence" and & "Institute of Strategic or Security related Interest" is also granted to the University by the Government of Gujarat and the status of "Center of Excellence for Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances" is conferred by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.

The two Institutions agree to exchange students under the following terms and conditions:

1. The Memorandum covers the exchange of Undergraduate, Post-graduate and Doctoral students. Hereinafter "exchange student" shall refer to a student participating in the Student Exchange Program implemented herein.
2. Exchange students shall not be liable for examination fees, registration fees and tuition fees at the host university and they will continue to pay the fee to the respective home Institutions.
3. Exchange students shall be liable for all expenses except the fees

 



mentioned above.

4. The number of exchange students accepted by the host university shall not exceed 20 person at a given time in a year. The period of attendance at the host university for exchange students shall not exceed one year (two semesters).
5. Exchange students accepted by each university shall have the status of special undergraduate students/special graduate students/ special graduate students”.
6. Exchange students shall possess language proficiency sufficient to comprehended lectures and conduct their research at the host university.
7. Upon students’ requests, each university can recognize the academic credits awarded or course work evaluated by the host university for its own exchange students, according to the criteria and procedure of the home university.
8. Each home university shall have the permission in advance from the host university when the home university selects its own exchange student(s).
9. Exchange students shall be responsible for their medical insurance and other forms of personal insurance.

Except as may be stipulated in any specific program agreement, each institution shall be responsible for expenses incurred by its employees under this agreement. Before planning any joint activity, financial responsibilities of each party shall be reduced in writing and agreed upon.

Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

Supplementary Provision

1. This agreement shall be effective from the date of signing and shall remain in force for a period of three years following this date. The validity of the Memorandum may be extended when mutually agreeable to both parties.
2. Amendments to and termination of the Memorandum must be performed by a written agreement between Indian Institute of Information Technology Senapati (IIIT) - Manipur and National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU), Gandhinagar, Gujarat.
